10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Rotunda, a Victorian Filigree style octagonal bandstand of timber and castiron with a corrugated iron roof, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

it serves as a meeting place for the community of Cue and surrounding districts and is valued for its role as a site of social and cultural interaction;

its function as a memorial to the early pioneers of Cue makes it of significance to the community of Cue and the surrounding districts. It is a reminder of the struggle to establish the town against great physical hardship;

it commemorates those particular individuals who established the town of Cue and those who contributed to it in later years through public service. Its location over , or very close to, the site of the original town well adds to the importance of the site;

the place is significant as a landmark in the town of Cue. Its central and prominent position in the main street makes it a key symbol of both the town and the district and contributes to the community's sense of place; and,

its role in the streetscape of Cue is significant because it gives a visual focus to the elements of the main street.
