10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Byfield House, a Federation Queen Anne style, two-storey, brick and tile residence, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is valued by the community as the former home of James Byfield, a prominent figure involved with the development of Northam at the beginning of the twentieth century;

the place demonstrates the wealth acquired by its former owner as a direct result of the gold boom era;

the opulent and stylistic ornamentation displayed at the place creates visual and aesthetic interest; and,

the imposing entrance tower and the location of the building above the township of Northam give the place a landmark quality.
