3. **LOCATION** west of Mews rd, Fremantle
4. **DESCRIPTION OF ELEMENTS INCLUDED IN THE ENTRY (GENERAL)**

A single storey limestone building with a hipped iron roof. Opening types vary, but the heavy stone arched opening on the east face is of interest. There is a stone cornice line halfway up the exterior walls. Now used as a pottery studio.
