10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**
Fmr Roads Board Office, Nanson, a small brick and iron hall built in Federation Free style, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 - the place illustrates Government policy for the first quarter of the twentieth century which actively encouraged people to settle on the land;
 - the site of the place demonstrates the importance of railways in the European settlement of the State;
 - the aesthetic qualities of the place contribute to a distinctive character in the town setting and are valued by the local community;
 - and,

the place contributes significantly to the sense of place and community in the Chapman Valley district.

The adjacent tank and brick and concrete toilet block are of little heritage significance.
