10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Tenterden Agricultural Hall, a Jarrah weatherboard and corrugated iron roofed building, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place has great social importance for the Tenterden community as it was the only building available for social, cultural and religious purposes before construction of the Anglican Church in 1927, and remains an important meeting place for the members of the rural community today;

the place was an integral part of the early town centre; and,

the place is a simple utilitarian building of elegant proportions that reflects the requirements of an isolated country community in the early 1900s.
