10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE
Jalbarragup Bridge (ruin), a now-disused turn of the century wooden river bridge, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is the only remaining turn of the century wooden bridge over the Blackwood River surviving in its original form, and one of few such bridges left in this State;

the place is an important link with bridge-building techniques at the turn of the century, particularly in respect of the hewn timbers of the bracing and waling* ; and,

the place is important in relation to the early development of transport routes and facilities in the Nannup district.

* Waling - the secondary stabilising elements of a structure.
