10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Edith Dircksey Cowan Memorial, a six metre high clock tower constructed of Donnybrook freestone in the Inter-war Art Deco style, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the Memorial commemorates the life and achievements of Edith Dircksey Cowan, Australia's first woman parliamentarian;

the memorial is believed to be the first civic monument erected in Australia to honour an Australian woman:

the Memorial is a fine example of the Inter-war Art Deco style incorporating indigenous floral motifs;

the Memorial has landmark qualities and marks the entrance to Kings Park;

the Memorial was designed by architect Harold Boas, the bronze portrait bust of Edith Cowan was by artist Margaret Johnson; and,

the clocks on the Memorial are representative of the few remaining functioning public clocks in the city of Perth.
