PHYSICAL AND DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE

The station was founded in approximately 1877 when the Overland Telegraph Line was constructed. Buildings of timber were replaced with new and larger buildings in 1896 to the 'standard design' of George Temple Poole, under the supervision of builders Payne and Locke. Only the stone walls remain.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The place has been assessed by the National Trust of Australia (WA) and has been entered in the Register held by that body as a classified building with the following statement of significance:

The station has historical significance as a link in the Albany-Eucla to South Australia telegraph system.

The place has also been assessed by the Australian Heritage Commission and has been entered in the Register of the National Estate with the following statement of significance:

The station came into operation in 1877 and was used until 1917. Was a residential operational station and a link in the Albany-Eucla/South Australia telegraph system.
