10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE  
*Masonic Lodge (former)*, a timber framed structure clad with corrugated iron, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
  - the place has outstanding significance for its architecture - the use of sophisticated 'Victorian Second Empire' style in a remote location, using corrugated iron and timber as building materials
  - the place demonstrates an innovative use of building materials and a high degree of craftsmanship;
  - the place is an imposing landmark in Cue;
  - the place contributes to the streetscape which is enhanced by its use of iron, a dominant streetscape material; and,

construction of the building is closely associated with the rapid development of Cue as the regional centre for the Murchison Goldfield.
