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## **10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

The *Archbishop's Palace*, a three storey, cement rendered structure, roofed with corrugated asbestos sheets, has cultural significance for the following reasons:

the place is of high value to members of the Roman Catholic community as the historical and current seat of power for the Archbishop of Perth;

the place is a good example of the Federation Academic Classical style of architecture by the prominent architect, Michael Cavanagh; and,

the place is an important component in the Victoria Square precinct and is a landmark in the area. The two brick buildings in the south-west corner of the place obscure the setting of the *Archbishop's Palace* and have little cultural heritage significance.
