## 10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Willow Gully comprising: house and associated walls; smokehouse; cottage (former kitchen); two-storey barn; servant's quarters; shearing shed; blacksmith's shop; stable block (partial ruins); wells; early cottage group; a framed corrugated iron shearing shed (c. 1910) and substantial orchard walls, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place has aesthetic value as a unified group of farm buildings set in the landscape and forming a picturesque composition enhanced by the use of connecting stone walls;

the place has rarity as a relatively complete example of its type;

the place is representative of a phase of agricultural development of the State and the Northampton District; and the place contributes to the community's sense of place.  $\label{eq:community}$
