## 10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

*Midland Post Office* has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

it is a fine and rare example of civic government buildings constructed for large regional centres;

it is aesthetically linked with civic buildings within the historic civic precinct of Midland;

it is a fine example of the civic architecture of Hillson Beasley, Principal Government Architect, 1897-1905;

it is an important part of the streetscape of the town centre;

the building represents the development of telecommunication services in the State and particularly, to the growth of railway and industrial centres in the early 1900s; and,

the attached residence is a demonstration of a particular way of life of the postmaster in society at the time.

Outbuildings associated with the Post Office are assessed as having little cultural heritage significance at this time.
