10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

*St Margaret's Anglican Church, Nedlands (1937)*, an Inter-War Art Deco style church with Inter-War Gothic elements, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is representative of the influence of Archbishop Le Fanu during his time as Anglican Archbishop of Perth (1929-1946), who believed that God should be worshipped in beautiful, holy architecture; and,

the place is a fine and rare example of an Inter-War Art Deco style church with Inter-War Gothic elements in Western Australia.
