10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Saint Elizabeth's Anglican Church, the former Police Station and Courthouse, a single-storey brick and iron building, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

it is one of the oldest buildings in Broomehill and contributes to the community's sense of place;

the place is highly valued by the local community. Its existence is testimony to the effort the community was prepared to expend in order to obtain their own place of worship; the place was purchased and renovated with funds raised by local efforts, and represents the country philosophy of community self-help;

the fabric of the place reflects change over time: movement of population, change in usage, and memorials to members of the congregation including those lost in war;

the transformation from a police station into a church makes the place an uncommon structure;

the original building was designed by architect George Temple Poole; and,

the altar is constructed of bricks from the old 1884 Eticup Church.
