10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

Dardanup State School (fmr), comprising a brick and iron classroom building in the Federation Queen Anne style, two honour boards, bicentennial monument, gardens and shelter shed, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is rare as a state school financed by the Education Department rather than the Public Works Department, on a contract let to a private architect;

the place is an intact, modest example of a rural school building in Federation Queen Anne style which is an integral part of the historic town centre of Dardanup and contributes positively to the streetscape; and,

the place is highly valued by the people of Dardanup, past students and teachers for its role as a community facility since 1896.

The ablution block and shelter shed are of little significance.
