10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE
Saint Peter's Catholic Church, a limestone masonry church with corrugated iron clad, duo pitched roof, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is important in relation to the historical development of the Greenough community;

the place contributes towards a general historical understanding of the spread of settlement through Western Australia, being an early building of consequence in the north-west, and therefore is important for its contribution to the public's understanding of the history of the community, locality and State;

the place is of social value to a large number of Catholics who are presently associated with it, or have been in the past, and is

important for its part in the development of the local Catholic church;

the place contributed to the development of Greenough's social-historical character;

the place is valued by the community for both its intrinsic aesthetic qualities as a fine example of Australian ecclesiastical vernacular, with specific elements of particular merit in terms of craftsmanship and creative excellence; and,

the place has landmark qualities and is a focal point within the streetscape, contributing to the overall aesthetic of the Greenough hamlet.

A windmill, outhouse and stables situated on Lot 4 behind *Saint Peter's Catholic Church* are not included in this assessment.
