11. ASSESSMENT OF CULTURAL HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

The criteria adopted by the Heritage Council in November, 1996 have been used to determine the cultural heritage significance of the place.

11.1 AESTHETIC VALUE

Donegan's Cottage has aesthetic value as a very simple example of a vernacular cottage built in the Federation period and adapted to the needs and resources of the Donegan family. (Criterion 1.1)

Donegan's Cottage has a landmark quality in Toodyay. Its fairly elevated site makes it visible from many parts of the town. (Criterion 1.3)

11. 2. HISTORIC VALUE

Donegan's Cottage has some significance as one of only a few early 'worker's cottage' residences remaining in Toodyay, and was occupied continuously by a family with a long work history in the town. (Criterion 2.1)

11. 4. SOCIAL VALUE

Donegan's Cottage holds significant social value to the Toodyay community, as evidenced by action taken by the Toodyay Historical Society Inc. to prevent its demolition. (Criterion 4.1)

12. DEGREE OF SIGNIFICANCE

12.1. RARITY

The place is of a type that is now uncommon in Toodyay. (Criterion 5.1)

12.2 REPRESENTATIVENESS

This place is a representative example of a vernacular 'worker's cottage' built at the turn of the century, and is characteristic of its class. (Criterion 6.2)

12.3 CONDITION

Donegan's Cottage is in fair condition and is structurally capable of sustaining remedial work. The place has suffered in recent years from a lack of occupancy and maintenance.

12.4 INTEGRITY

The integrity of this place is moderate, and its restoration is achievable.

12.5 AUTHENTICITY

The place is intact and retains moderate authenticity, taken in the context of evolution of use. Little has occurred internally in the way of intrusive changes.
