10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

*Haddrill's House* comprising: homestead; garden; and grave, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is a rare example of a house constructed in the first six years of the Swan River Colony. The setting of the place is enhanced by the retention of most of the original garden;

the place demonstrates aspects of the European settlement of the Swan District for agricultural purposes, and has potential to yield information regarding the way of life of colonists in the Swan River Colony;

the place has a close association with the Haddrill family, who lived there from 1835 to 1975;

the place demonstrates the aesthetic characteristics of Old Colonial Georgian architecture; and,

the garden demonstrates the principal characteristics of an homestead garden of the early nineteenth century.

The blue gum forest is intrusive.
