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10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**  
*Subiaco Theatre Centre*, a two-storey Post-War International style concrete building with a corrugated asbestos roof, together with its associated gardens, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:
 

the place is an important and representative example of civic design for the period, late 1950s and early 1960s, when civic pride and innovative design expressed the confidence of the community;

the place is an important element in the historical development of the City of Subiaco;

the place is important for its role in the social life of the community, initially as the Civic Hall and currently as a theatre;

the place is a rare example of post-war architecture in Western Australia where the building design was based on a strict proportioning system, resulting in an expression of refined simplicity and unity;

the place and its landscape setting contribute to the community's sense of place; and,

the place and its garden park setting, contributes to the aesthetic value of the landscape and have landmark qualities in the streetscape.

The gardens have some significance as a setting for the building.
