### **10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

*Three Cottages* are brick and corrugated metal sheeting roofed dwellings. The northern sides of the buildings are characteristically Colonial, while the later additions on the southern sides reflect the late Victorian/Federation period. They are of exceptional significance for the following reasons:

the place is a rare surviving example of early housing in the Northbridge area demonstrating specific characteristics of the 1860s and of later additions dating from 1890s; and of a continuous residential site;

the cottages are important elements representative of the standards, architectural styles and methods of construction for small residential buildings in the second half of the 19<sup>th</sup> century;

the place is historically important as evidence of the social development of the City and as early permanent residential buildings on the edge of the Town;

the grounds are of archaeological value for the potential to provide evidence of 19<sup>th</sup> century customs and uses of the buildings; and,

the place is of social value for its association with the people who built and used the buildings in the Colonial and Victorian period and for providing a sense of place for the present Northbridge community.

Of little cultural heritage significance are the new works to the cottages.
