10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Drakesbrook School (fmr), a timber framed, weatherboard and corrugated iron one-room school building, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is one of only three remaining pre-1900 weatherboard oneroom school buildings in Western Australia still in their original location;

it is the only school building of its period of its particular design;

it is the oldest public building in Waroona and the longest operating school in the district and, as such, contributes to the community's sense of place;

it contributes to the aesthetic qualities of the surrounding parkland and has some landmark value being the only major structure within the expanse of the former school grounds; and, the place is evidence of the development of educational facilities in the district and the type of facilities provided by government from 1895 to 1915.
