10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Mangowine, comprising the Cottage (c. 1874), adjacent building with cellar (c. 1889) which was used as Inn between 1889 and 1894, two graves, and other related buildings, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the fabric of the place is substantially original and represents a style of building and rural habitation which is disappearing as similar buildings and groupings fall into decay;

the place was an important way stop for prospectors on their journey to the gold fields and for members of the local community as a place of rest and refreshment on journeys to other towns;

the place has a close association with Special Constable Charles Adams, who built the place and is buried there;

the place demonstrates aspects of the history of the European settlement of the district; and,

the place is held in high esteem by the community as an historic place.

The relocated Baandee Country Women's Association Rest Room has significance. The blacksmith's lean-to, caretaker's cottage (1977) and new bough shed are assessed as having low significance at this time.
