10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Great Fingall Mine Office (fmr), a single-storey stone administrative and assay building in the Federation Italianate style, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

it is a well designed and solidly built stone building located in a remote part of Western Australia;

it is a unique demonstration of the combination of mine office and assay room purposely built for a prosperous mining company during Western Australia's gold boom at the turn of this century, and is of particular value in demonstrating the operations of an assay room;

the growth of the town of Day Dawn was largely a consequence of the wealth produced in the Great Fingall Mine, which operated from 1898 to 1918. The mine office, the only substantial building still standing in the former Day Dawn townsite, is a reminder of the historic importance of the mine and Day Dawn in the mining of the Murchison region; and,

it is an important reminder of the cycle of growth and decline of mining towns associated with the State's gold boom at the turn of this century.
