

# REGISTER OF HERITAGE PLACES - ASSESSMENT DOCUMENTATION

## 11. ASSESSMENT OF CULTURAL HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE

The criteria adopted by the Heritage Council in September, 1991 have been used to determine the cultural heritage significance of the place.

#### 11. 1 AESTHETIC VALUE

The interior of *Cummins Theatre* is substantially intact and exhibits a 1920s style of decoration. (Criterion 1.1)

*Cummins Theatre* exhibits architecturally significant characteristics and has a quality of design construction and detail that contributes to the aesthetic qualities of the landscape. (Criterion 1.3)

#### 11. 2. HISTORIC VALUE

*Cummins Theatre* demonstrates the tradition of relocating buildings from the Goldfields to other areas of the State, in the early part of the twentieth century. In 1928, *Cummins Theatre* was reconstructed to the style of theatres of that time, with internal alterations to the earlier (relocated) fabric and with some additional construction. (Criterion 2.4)

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## 11. 4. SOCIAL VALUE

As a venue for the Repertory Club, *Cummins Theatre* has high significance for theatre goers in Merredin. (Criterion 4.1)

*Cummins Theatre* has been a focal point for a variety of cultural and recreational activities by the Merredin community since 1928, and so contributes to the community's sense of place. (Criteria 4.2)

#### 12. DEGREE OF SIGNIFICANCE

#### **12. 1. RARITY**

The place is unusually large for a country theatre and, whereas many other theatres of its kind have been altered or lost, the intactness of *Cummins Theatre* is uncommon. (Criterion 5.1)

#### 12. 2 REPRESENTATIVENESS

*Cummins Theatre* is representative of the style of theatre architecture constructed in country towns in the 1920s, and of the importance of theatre as a form of entertainment at that time. (Criteria 6.1, 6.2)

#### 12.3 CONDITION

The place was conserved in accordance with the conservation plan in 1993. For a detailed discussion of the condition of the fabric of the place see Kevin Palassis, Architect, 'Conservation Plan, Cummins Theatre, Merredin' (for the Heritage Council of W. A., 30 January 1992). *Cummins Theatre* is in good condition.

#### 12. 4 INTEGRITY

*Cummins Theatre* continues to be used for theatrical purposes. Recent conservation of the place has increased the use of the place as a theatrical venue. The current use of the place by the Repertory Club is a compatible use. *Cummins Theatre* retains a high degree of integrity.

#### 12.5 AUTHENTICITY

Little of the fabric of the place has been altered. *Cummins Theatre* retains a high degree of authenticity.
