#### 7. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE OF PLACE (ASSESSMENT IN DETAIL)

The place has been assessed by the National Trust of Australia (WA) and has been entered in the Register held by that body as a classified building with the following statement of significance:

As courthouse, and laster as part of the Museum, the building has been associated with the public life of WA for many years and it holds an added interest on account of its use for a period as a convict prison.

The place has also been assessed by the Australian Heritage Commission and has been entered in the Register of the National Estate with the following statement of significance:

A fine stone building of which the facade on the Beaufort Street side is generally considered one of the best examples in the State of colonial architecture of the period. As courthouse and later as part of the Museum the building has been associated with the public life of WA for many years and it holds an added interest on account of its use as a convict prison.
