10. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Peter Pan, Coolgardie, a single-storey face brick and stone residence with a hipped corrugated iron roof, built in 1898 in Federation Queen Anne style, and named after a Melbourne Cup Winner, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is an outstanding example of a substantial and intact single storey stone and iron residence in Federation Queen Anne style in the Eastern Goldfields; the place demonstrates the scale and ambition of business and household life on the Eastern Goldfields at the height of the gold mining boom at the end of the 19th century; and,

the place was built as an office for the New Austral mining company and residence for its manager in 1898, when Coolgardie was the administrative and business centre of the Eastern Goldfields.
