10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

Railway Hotel, a single-storey brick and iron hotel in the Federation Free Style, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

 - the place is a rare example of a single-storey hotel, constructed in the 1890s, in the Perth metropolitan area;
 - the place is important as a substantial remnant associated with the early North Fremantle residential subdivision;
 - the place is important as a landmark at the corner of Tydeman Road and De Lisle Street;

the place has associations with the early railway development in North Fremantle, having been constructed adjacent to the original North Fremantle railway station;

the place has specifically catered for the local clientele of workers from the nearby wharfs and marshalling yards, and continues to be highly valued by its patrons; and,

the place is highly valued by a section of the wider community for the jazz sessions that have been running since 1976.

The lounge bar addition at the rear of the building has little heritage significance.
