10. **STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

Agricultural Hall (fmr), Kellerberrin, a single-storey stone building with brick quoining and a corrugated iron gable roof, constructed in two stages (1898, 1907) and showing influences of Federation Romanesque style, has cultural heritage significance for the following reasons:

the place is a fine, intact example of a Federation Romanesque style stone and iron hall, typifying the scale, materials and design of agricultural halls in Western Australia in the 1890s; and,

the place represents the practice in regional areas of adapting civic buildings for various uses over time, having been a school (1905-07,

1968-70), Roads Board (1908-10), Courthouse (1937-67), and (to the present, 2006) a Folk Museum.

The steel clad outbuilding on the north boundary is of no significance.
